Christ, the King and the Kingdom of those who love...

8am John XXIII Church,

10am Holy Trinity Church

Kings and kingdoms are a recurring theme in Scripture and in the parables of Jesus. Our understanding of the king is present at the start of the gospel reading today. "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory." To live in a kingdom is about far more than standing to wonder at the majesty of the king and we may be in real danger of missing the essence of the kingdom and the king if we focus too much on the majesty of the king. It's an easy mistake to make: One that we hear about again and again in the gospels. The Magi, eyes fixed on the star, going into the royal palace of Herod while the king they seek was in the least likely shelter, the stable. The Palm Sunday crowds who seem to speak prophetic truth as they shout "Hosanna to the Son of David" but whose expectations of uprising and messianic triumph are disappointed by the events of Good Friday. So it is not a matter of heralds with trumpets, of unmistakeable majesty; but of recognising the king where he is always to be found: "with those on the edge". There the question of judgement and choices comes. We need to realise that it is our judgements, our choices that will make all the difference. Those judgements, those choices, will be governed by our allegiance to Christ the king or to other rulers. If we want to live in the kingdom, then Christ the king is the one who sets the standards, who shows us what kingdom life will be. Christ, who chose to spend his time with the marginalised, the oppressed and the forgotten, Christ who is utterly committed to those whom nobody values, nobody respects, Christ who identifies himself so completely with "the least of these" that when we look at them, we know we are seeing him too. The hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick, the prisoner... People who NEED us, who need very specific care - not just a generalised expression of good will... People we probably won't be at ease with, people who may demand things that we find it very hard to deliver. People we might not like, but are called to love. People in whose faces we should expect to see the face of Christ. Thomas Merton once said that the kingdom of God is not one that preaches a particular doctrine or follows certain religious practices, it is the kingdom of those who love. That's what lies at the heart of our parable - and at the heart of the kingdom. Fr. Manu Kumbidiyamackal
