"The call in the Wilderness: change and be comforted ..."

In the wilderness the call of the prophet comes to us today: "Comfort, comfort my people. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem." For most of the people John preached too, life was a hard enough struggle already, without this rather bizarre figure appearing from nowhere and telling them that they all needed to repent and change their ways of life. But the ordinary people at that time took his fierce and accusatory message seriously and welcomed it, because they recognised John's special calling. John was able to speak with great moral authority about doing penance because he himself was living a lifestyle of repentance, in a way that nobody could criticise. Christian life has to include these two basic elements of John's spirituality, message and practice. But today we have come to a tendency that as Christians we can have the same way of life and the same values that everyone else has in our society and a lot of the discussion about 'modernising' in the Church is really a code for accommodating and compromising with the values of consumer capitalism, rather than remaining faithful to our alternative way of life. So when we listen to the message of hope and promise today; the call is clear, it is to change our ways and return to God. Yes, this message does not come to us in the comfortable places of our homes and families but in the wilderness of uncertain, difficult times in which we live. We have members who have lost their jobs; many of us have seen our incomes shrink. We are in the midst of economic downturn and all of that brings fear and uncertainty as well. We aren't sure whether anyone is willing to confront the problems we face as a society. It might seem that like John we are in a wilderness, with little to hope for. Here there is a promise of a new beginning. But we need to remember that Jesus came, not in clouds of glory to transform the universe, but as a baby to a couple who were homeless. The love he brought came into a world that rejected him. We hear John crying in the wilderness, we experience the wilderness of our own lives and the wilderness of our culture. To hope in God's coming in that wilderness does not mean that everything will change. The message is clear what is most important is changing one's own ways; we need to make straight our paths. May this Advent be for us a word of comfort in the midst of the desert.


