The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ celebrates the central celebration of Christianity – the Eucharist. All three readings relate to this Eucharistic theme. In the second reading, we have the first written account of the Last Supper and what came to be seen as Jesus instigating the Eucharist. Paul's account, written well before the gospels, was entrenched in the tradition by the time the gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke echoed these words of Jesus at the Last Supper. Of course, it is these same words that are spoken by the priest at the consecration in the Eucharistic Prayer each Mass. The words used today are the very same words that have been used in the Church for two millennia. Rather than a gospel account of the Last Supper to celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, we are presented with what is widely regarded as another 'Eucharistic' story from the Gospel of Luke. The feeding of the five thousand with five loaves and two fish is regarded as a Eucharistic story because it was a clear example of God's presence in a miraculous meal. All of the meal stories in the gospel of Luke are instructive for the audience. Whenever the gospel writer refers to a meal, the meal is used to teach about the reign of God. The gospel writer uses meals to demonstrate who is welcome in the reign of God. Like in today's gospel, the author of Luke's gospel was keen to show that the reign of God is available to anyone who wishes to be a part of it. The reign of God is inclusive and welcoming; no one will be turned away.

KIDS CORNER 29th May 2016



Who do you invite when you share a meal?

Who does Jesus invite to share in his sacred meal?

What are some of the things we do at this sacred meal, the Mass? (Listen to God's Word, bring forward gifts, sing, pray, join in processions etc)

Eucharist means 'thanksgiving'. What can we thank God for in the Eucharist today?

The first couple of sentences are very important: Jesus welcomed the people, spoke to them about God's kingdom, and healed everyone. All this happens before Jesus fed all the people with a few loaves and fishes.

This story is like a summary of Christian life, the way Jesus wants us to live. Jesus was welcoming and open to everyone, especially those who are neglected. He showed what God's kingdom was like in his own conduct, in the way he treated others and cared for them. Jesus was attentive to all the 'hungers' that people had within them: he cured those that were sick, comforted the sad, gave hope to those who had no hope.

Jesus gave us the great sacrament of his Body and Blood so that he could do the same for us, and so that we would be able to do these things for those around us.

Notice that the disciples wanted to send the people away to get food for themselves, but Jesus tells them 'You feed them'.

Sometimes, like the disciples, we may feel that we can't do such a big job. But Jesus stepped in and helped them. Jesus does the same for us. He asks us to treat others the way he would treat them, but he always helps us to do it. Jesus helps us through our families, our church community, our children's liturgy, and our building ourselves up through receiving Jesus in Communion. Together we help remind each other of who we are – the Body of Christ on earth – and we help each other to act like Jesus.

This reminds us that in receiving the Body and Blood of Christ, we 'become' Christ for others. What are some of the hungers that people have? (Peace, safety, food, shelter, love, acceptance, Encouragement etc.) How can we help meet those needs?

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, you are the living bread which comes to each one of us
In a special way.
Help me to share the joy of your love with others I meet.
Amen

The quote for this was \$828.00 for the pump, installation and electrical work. Over a hundred dollars was raised and we now have \$227.00 towards this project. We have another fundraiser coming up in June, thanks to Pauline and Betty.

When we have reached our goal of \$828.00 we will have the pump installed. This will save water and we will be able to grow more vegetables, herbs and water our fruit trees. This community garden is not for profit but for reaching out, having fun and growing healthy fresh food.
