Take up the Mission

The instructions of Jesus in today's Gospel to the seventy-two missionaries, is an invitation to each one of us for a mission to carry out. There were just a handful of followers in Jesus' day to preach the Good News, but today there are over one billion Roman Catholics and about half a billion other Christians (in 30,000 denominations!) who accept Jesus as "Lord" and "Saviour." So there are 1.5 billion missionaries in a world of six billion people. A recent survey asked the question, "Why do adults join the Catholic Church in spite of the scandals publicised in the media?" 75% of the new adult converts to the Catholic Church reported that they were attracted by a personal invitation from a Catholic who had a lively relationship with Christ and his Church. As faithful Catholics, it is our responsibility to attract others to the Church and thus to Christ our Lord. It's a task entrusted to each of us at the time of our baptism. We need to consider it as our responsibility and just as the responsibility of the priest and religious or a handful of other members who are very active in the proclamation of faith. So we need to make sure that we do not miss the current opportunities to be apostles in everyday life by our words and deeds. We live in a very complex world. Therefore, in our practice of faith we need to be careful to avoid giving counter-witness.

The Church is founded on the rock of Peter, a humble, uneducated fisherman who died for the Lord he loved. Compare his Faith and heroic witnessing with the “supermarket Catholicism” of our modern day society: Christians who publicly proclaim their “Catholicism,” yet support abortion, gay marriage, human cloning and experimentation with human embryos. We should not be “Catholics for a Free Choice” who oppose anything proposed by the Church, including the most basic right to life. Nor should we be armchair Catholics, spiritual weekend warriors, “cafeteria Catholics” or “barely-make-it-to-Mass” members of the Church, who bear counter-witness to the values proclaimed by Christ. Instead, let us become heralds of the Kingdom in our own homes by treating each other with profound respect. Then let us teach it to the new generation. When we respect each other and, thus, teach others to do the same, all those who mingle with us will experience the Kingdom in our families and in the society that we live. Thus we will prove to the world that the Kingdom of God is God’s rule in our hearts enabling us to do His will.
