# Out from the boat totally into the hands of God..... 19<sup>th</sup> Sunday Year A: Mt 14:22-33

The story comes after the dramatic feeding of the five thousand. The people have eaten and the extra loaves of bread and fish have been collected and counted. The gospel of Matthew records that Jesus "immediately made the disciples" get into the boat. Jesus senses an urgency to the hour. The disciples must be separated from the crowd. He forces the disciples to get into the boat and set out onto the lake. Why did Jesus act with such haste? The apostle John records that a rumour was circulating in the crowd to make him king. Jesus did not want to jeopardise his mission by a political uprising so he sent his lieutenants off, dismissed his all-too-eager voluntary would-be recruits and sought the safety of solitude on the mountain. He must resist once again the temptation for power and authority. Jesus understands that the only way to resist this temptation is to walk away. By doing so, Jesus shows us that the first step of faith requires the resistance to temptation.

In the second part of the gospel we see Peter asking permission to come to Jesus. I have often wondered about Peter's reasons for asking to walk on the water. Was he testing Jesus? Did he want to verify if this was really his Lord? Was he trying to prove the miracle to himself? Was he driven by his ego, to be the only disciple who would walk on the water? Peter was a lot like us. He probably had many different reasons for walking on the water. Some were probably quite noble and some were quite ego centered. The point of the story is neither why did Peter ask nor that he asked. The point of the story is that Peter took the step of faith by leaping into the troubled waters of uncertainty.

Remember, at some point in our lives, we have to leave behind the safety and security of the boat. We have to step into the realm of the unknown. We must be willing to trust our life to our Lord's care. That is a difficult step. We spend our lives building a security net around us. We work hard to insulate ourselves from the danger of failure, the threat of the unknown and the terror of uncertainty. We get pretty comfortable in our boats. Then God asks us to step out of our boat. To go and talk to a friend about our faith; to volunteer for something that requires us to venture into things that we have never done before; We do not feel prepared. We are not good public speakers. We do not have any teaching gifts. We do not know what to say to someone who is dying. That is the water God is expecting us to walk on. Do we believe enough in the one who can hold our hands.....?



#### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.)

We will be starting our sessions soon for catechumens (not baptised) and candidates (baptised but do not have all sacraments) for R.C.I.A. The Second Vatican Council prescribed the revision of the rite of baptism of adults and decreed that the catechumenate for adults, divided into several steps, should be restored. By this means the time of the catechumenate, which is intended as a period of well-suited instruction, would be sanctified by liturgical rites to be celebrated at successive intervals of time. The Council likewise decreed that both the solemn and simple rites of adult baptism should be revised, with proper attention to the restored catechumenate.
