The temple was understood as the dwelling place of God among his people. Jesus' dramatic cleansing of the temple; which three gospels report was seen by his disciples as a prophetic sign of God's action. But the same act was a startling



and provocative act for the chief priests, scribes and Pharisees and his words, especially about the destruction of the temple triggered an alarm for the guardians of this venerable place and caused them to take steps to stop this trouble-maker from Galilee. If he overturned the tables in the entranceway and drove people out, what would he do next? Above all they were worried about the economic loss that they will incur because of the act of Jesus. Jesus tells that the house of God is a house of prayer. In his house the offering is not animals, birds or money but one's own self. Today let us think of all that can keep us from the presence of God and pray with fervent devotion:

and cleanse us from all that makes us unholy.

Silence the noise that prevents us hearing you,
and help us see when we are blind.

Turn over the barriers that block your word,
drive away the distractions that stop our awareness of you.

Give us the wisdom of your commandments.

For you command only what is good,
