# **Changes to Parish Office Hours**

### Please Note:

From the beginning of July the office will remain closed on all Mondays. It is after much prayer and deliberation that we have come to this decision.

My dear brothers and sisters it is not a very pleasant news for me to inform you that we are forced to cut down on the working hours of the office staff as our planned giving (income for the regular running and maintenance of the parish) is on a steady decline.

We have come to a point wherein we need to really think and plan for the future. The decline in income has caused a situation wherein we have to reduce the work hours of the office staff. Grace, Pauline and Sindi will lose six hours each from their work. As you know most of the work was directly managed from the office and they used to be working even out of time to meet the needs of the parish to which we gave not much of a notice.

With the reduced work hours it is going to be a very hard task on them to complete all that they were doing previously. Losing six hours in a week out of the eighteen hours is going to be very hard on them as well. We should not be expecting them to do all that they were doing previously. #### The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

Today is Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, a day on which we honor the Lord's Supper, the Eucharist, the Mass, which Jesus instituted as a memorial of his sacrifice of himself on the cross for the salvation of the world. This memorial makes present the one and only, unrepeatable sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross that he offered to the Father in reparation for the sins of the world. The Eucharist was instituted during a Jewish Passover supper, when they remembered their salvation from slavery in Egypt and from the plague of the death of the firstborn, because of the blood of the paschal lamb. Jesus is the fulfillment of the paschal lamb. He is "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). His blood, shed in sacrifice for our sins on the cross (1 Cor. 15:3), saves us from our sins, justifies us, forgives us, and gives us the freedom of the children of God. So when instituting the Eucharist, Jesus said, "This is my blood; of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins" (Matt. 26:28).

The Eucharist is the sacrifice of the New Covenant, for it makes present for us the one and only, unrepeatable sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross. It is Christ who offers himself for our sins in the Eucharistic celebration. Yet his once and for all sacrifice on the cross is not repeated but made present for us so that we might offer it with him to the Father in the Holy Spirit for the glory of God and the salvation of the world. Therefore, the Holy Eucharist is the sacrifice of the New Covenant. It is our act of worship as Christians. In the Eucharist we receive Holy Communion, whereby we eat the flesh and drink the blood of Christ for the life of our spirit. This is spiritual food in which we taste and experience the sweetness of Christ as we sit in silent contemplation, praying directly to Christ who is physically present within us. Thus the reception of Holy Communion should be a great aid to contemplative prayer. Let us today approach the Eucharist with a more lively faith in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and we shall experience therein God's saving power and transforming love. Then we will be able to shout aloud with deep faith and devotion: "O Sacrament most Holy, O Sacrament most Divine;

All praise and all thanksgiving, be every moment Thine."

#### The Role of Music in Sunday Mass Part I

If Sunday Mass goers were asked to list occasions in the Mass when the assembly should be singing, the results would probably vary quite considerably,

even among musicians. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) states that "great importance should be attached to the use of singing in the celebration of the Mass, with due consideration to the culture of peoples and abilities of each liturgical

assembly." (#39)

To being with the **Entrance hymn**, its purpose "is to open the celebration, foster the unity of those who have been gathered, introduce their thoughts to the mystery of the liturgical time and accompany the procession of the priest and ministers." (#47).

One way of encouraging this sense of unity and common purpose as the Eucharist begins is to choose music that is well known to the assembly and an appropriate introduction to the celebration.
