Is He not.....?

The gospel today brings us the obvious question: How could Jesus' family and friends reject him? They watched him grow up. They had to be aware of his loving nature and the fact that he worked hard, both as a student of the Torah (law) and as Joseph's apprentice (carpenter). Before leaving home he was acknowledged as a rabbi, a teacher, and he had disciples whom he taught. We can assume they heard about his success in ministry. Nazareth was only a short distance away from Capernaum which was his base of operations.

News travelled by word of mouth from one town to another and everyone was eager to hear and share what they heard. We have listened over the last four Sundays to Mark's gospel about the success of Jesus' ministry: how the crowds listened to his teachings, how they witnessed the healing of the sick and the possessed, and how astounded they were when Jesus brought Jairus' daughter back to life.

You may recall that in the synagogue at Capernaum the people were "amazed" and "accepted" his new way of teaching. But in the synagogue we visited today in Nazareth they were "offended," and they rejected him, crying out "Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?" We have heard of this theory; "Familiarity breeds contempt." The same is what Jesus meant when he said: "A prophet is not without honour, except in his own hometown, and among his own kin, and in his own house." This passage illustrates Jesus' humanity in a beautiful manner. Like us, he felt the pain of rejection, not only with his homecoming but increasingly through the rest of his ministry and ultimately on the cross. Through Jesus' humanity we know that "God feels our pain." And so this passage relates to our lives in several ways. When we reject others—we reject Jesus. It doesn't matter what our rejection is based on. When we reject others we do not love them as we were commanded to and we limit God's hand in their lives and in ours. When we reject those closest to us—we reject Jesus.

The Role of Music in Sunday Mass Part 4

Regarding music in the **Communion Rite**, the General Instruction makes a request that is yet to be widely adopted. It states:

"While the priest is receiving the Sacrament, the Communion chant is begun, its purpose being to express the spiritual union of the communicants by means of the unity of their voices, to show gladness of heart, and to bring out more clearly the 'communitarian' character of the procession to receive the Eucharist. The singing is prolonged for as long as the Sacrament is being administered to the faithful...#86

Starting the communion song as early as the priest's communion means that the musicians and choir members can only receive communion after the music has finished. Two extraordinary ministers could therefore be rostered each

Sunday to take the Body and Blood of Christ to the musicians after everyone else has received Holy Communion. Then a time for quiet reflection is the first option given once the assembly is still.
