We may also think that our task is to pray for these missionaries and also to give them some financial support.

Today's celebration of Mission Sunday reminds us that each one of us have an important role in the spreading of the gospel. We know that the faith we have is handed down to us by the earlier generation of believers. What we have received, we too must build up and hand over to the next generation. That is not just the work of missionaries, priests, religious and a selected few parishioners. A world without God and His truth and love becomes a dark and dangerous world. So, Mission Sunday reminds each of us that we have a task and a responsibility to spread the faith that we have received. When Jesus asked his disciples to follow him, when he asked them to lay down their lives and then sent them out to proclaim the Kingdom he was asking them to give witness. The disciples could do it without difficulty because they personally encountered Jesus. They were inspired by the life of the master and learned integrity of life from the master. Now we surely, have a personal encounter with Jesus in the Eucharistic celebration. The question posed before us is how genuine are we and how much of integrity of life do we have learned from the master. Do we proclaim the faith that we believe through the very way of our lives? This Mission Sunday should enable us to realise this fact that Jesus truly counts on us in proclaiming his love to the world. We need to do it by the very way that we live our Christianity.

<u>Healing Wounds and Warming Hearts!</u> Pope Francis

World Mental Health Day (WMHD) is a day for global mental health education, awareness and advocacy. It is an initiative of the World Federation for Mental Health. WMHD is an annual program held on 10th



October to raise public awareness of mental health issues worldwide. This year, the theme is: *Mental Health begins with me!* The theme aims to encourage people to personal ownership of their mental health and well-being. One in five Australians will experience mental illness this year. We all have a role to play in looking after our own mental health and well-being. When our parishes gather, nearly everyone will know someone who has a mental illness of varying severity and length. Because of the stigma attached to it, few will come forward, but it is there. How can we support people living with the stigma of mental illness?

People living with mental health challenges, are no less members of the Body of Christ than anyone else. People with mental illness and their families often feel isolated from their faith community and thus isolated from God. 
