Widow's offering ... the Measure of Generosity

The scribes and the Pharisees knew so much of the law but they missed the main point of it all, which is to love God and to love their neighbours. During the first century the scribes and few others were the only literate ones. Thus, they became learned of the law. So people looked at them as scholars of the law and put them on a pedestal and the scribes liked it so much, they did everything they could do just to get attention from the people. The most common place they would show off their social status was in the temple. There, they showed off their generosity by giving more coins. At that time in the temple there were thirteen collection chests for offerings for specific purposes. The rich people would show off by going from chest to chest and drop their coins for donation. Jesus noticed all these, so he left a word of caution to his disciples: 'Beware of the scribes.' This means 'don't go there', 'careful', or 'don't intimidate them'. Instead, look at this widow and pray you may grow in such love of God as she had demonstrated. Two small coins are all that she has, yet she selflessly gave it all as offerings to God and to the temple. Unlike the scribes and Pharisees who gave so much but still only the surplus of what they have actually got, this widow gave her all. Cont....
