Divine Mercy

The readings for this Sunday are about mercy, trust and the forgiveness of sins. The opening prayer addresses the Father as "God of everlasting Mercy." In the Responsorial Psalm, we repeat several times, "His mercy endures forever" (Ps 118). Besides mentioning the word, our readings illustrate mercy in action. How does God reveal His mercy? He does so, first and foremost, by sending His only-begotten Son to become our Saviour and Lord by his suffering, death and Resurrection. Divine Mercy is given to us in the celebration of the Sacraments. The first reading explains how the Risen Lord continued to show His Divine Mercy to the sick through the healing and preaching ministry of His apostles in the early Church. The apostles' Faith enabled them to minister to the people; giving them the Lord's healing love through "signs and wonders." The Book of Revelation was written to comfort and bolster the Faith of the persecuted Christians by reassuring them of the presence of the merciful Lord in their lives. The second reading, taken from Revelation, encourages Christians to fight fear with Faith, and anxiety about the future with trust and Hope. In today's Gospel, as we recall Jesus' appearance to the apostles, we are vividly reminded of the Sacrament of Reconciliation; the power to forgive sins which Our Lord gave to His apostles when he said: "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" (Jn. 20: 23). Today's Gospel also emphasizes the importance of Faith in the all-pervading presence of the Risen Lord of Mercy. To believe without having seen is every later Christian's experience. We are invited to receive liberation from doubts and hesitation by surrendering our lives to the Risen Lord of Mercy. Let us ask God our Father to open our hearts so that we may receive His Mercy in the form of His Holy Spirit. (The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC: A - Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world. B - Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us. C - Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive. From http://www.thedivinemercy.org/message/)

Gospel John 20:29

We believe our friends and family because we trust them and know that what they tell us would be true, but sometimes like Thomas we need to see things for ourselves to know that they are true. Thomas did not believe his



friends when they said that they had seen
Jesus. He had to touch Jesus so that he could
believe for himself. Recall Jesus' words to
Thomas: "Happy are those who have not seen
and yet believe'. You children are counted among
those who are blessed because you
believe in Jesus without seeing him.. Jesus also
said 'Peace be with you'. We are called to bring
peace of Jesus to our world and we can start to
do this by having peace in our own hearts.

PEACE, LOVE AND FRIENDSHIP



Building on the Second Vatican Council, Pope Francis calls us to the renewal of our parishes, schools and Communities. What is said below of parishes is meant to apply as well to other Eucharistic communities in our archdiocese. It also applies to parish schools and to other Catholic schools in ways that are appropriate to their different contexts. The Following are some characteristics of parishes in the process of renewal:

The parish is a community in which each member is called to the following of Jesus. The parish is directed towards discipleship, and understands itself as a community of disciples. It is a place of prayer and formation that enables parishioners to embrace what the Second Vatican Council termed the universal call to holiness. Each of the baptised is seen as having a gift of the Spirit given for the sake of all. Each one is different, but all are participants. All are involved in bringing the gospel of joy to the world: "To each is given a manifestation of the Spirit for the common good" (Cor 12:7). Our parishes and their schools will need to be places where members can learn to pray, to know and understand the Scriptures, and to discern and use their gifts in the cause of the kingdom of God in our world.

Eucharistic liturgies are prayerful and fully participative. The full and active participation of the whole people of God, men, women and children, that the Second Vatican Council called for should be evident in all our celebrations, along with the various lay ministries and the ministry of the deacon where possible. Good music is important. Many people are drawn to liturgies where there is inspiring music, times of silent prayer, as well as good preaching. Preparation of our liturgies is essential, and we should not schedule liturgies that we are unable to prepare well. If presiders are to give themselves fully to prayerful leadership of the Eucharist it may be necessary to limit rather than simply add on more Masses for our priests.
