Pray for Vocations

In his message for the 52nd World Day of Prayer for Vocations titled "Exodus, a fundamental experience of vocation" Pope Francis explains that "at the root of every Christian vocation there is an exodus that starts from the renouncement of the comfort and inflexibility of the self in order to go forth trustfully, like Abraham, towards the "new land" that God indicates to us." The Fourth Sunday of Easter offers us the figure of the Good Shepherd: he calls them, he feeds them and he guides them. For over 50 years the universal Church has celebrated this Sunday as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. In this way she reminds us of our need to pray, as Jesus himself told his disciples, so that 'the Lord of the harvest may send out labourers into his harvest'. Jesus' command came in the context of his sending out missionaries. Since the Church 'is by her very nature missionary', the Christian vocation is necessarily born of the experience of mission. Hearing and following the voice of Christ the Good Shepherd, means letting ourselves be attracted and guided by him, in consecration to him; allowing the Holy Spirit to draw us into this missionary dynamism, awakening within us the desire, the joy and the courage to offer our own lives in the service of the Kingdom of God. To offer one's life in mission is possible only if we are able to leave ourselves behind. Yes, this particular 'exodus' is the heart of vocation, or better vet, of our response to the vocation God gives us. Therefore, we pray today that our dear young friends are never afraid to go out from themselves and begin the journey. Let us pray that the Gospel message which brings freedom to our lives; transforms them. Always remember, how wonderful it is to be surprised by God's call, to embrace his word, and to walk in the footsteps of Jesus, in adoration of the divine mystery and in generous service to our neighbours.

While many of our parishes, schools and communities have worked hard at community-building and hospitality, Pope Francis urges us to go beyond ourselves, and our own natural groups, to others, above all to those in need. We need to find ways to make all kinds of people welcome, including the young, not only with welcoming smiles and words, but also in the whole experience of our churches, our symbols, our liturgies, and our actions. Our parishes need to bear witness to the mercy and generous love of God revealed in Jesus. We need to make sure that all feel welcome and loved, including new migrants, parents with sometimes noisy young children, those who suffer from mental and physical disabilities, people who are shy, and those who might tend to feel excluded because of their relationships or for other reasons. We also are called to reach out to pray and work in the mission of the Gospel with Christians from other denominations, and where appropriate join cause with people of other faiths.
