#### "Ask, Seek, Knock....."

The main themes of today's Scripture readings are the power of intercessory prayer, the Our Father as Gospel the ideal prayer, and the necessity for persistence and perseverance in prayer, with trusting faith and boldness. In short, they teach us what to pray and 25th St James how to pray. The first reading, taken from the book 26th of Genesis, gives us the model for intercessory 29th St Martha prayer provided by Abraham in his dialogue with 30th God. Although Abraham seems to be trying to manipulate God through his skilful bargaining and humble, persistent intercession, God is actually being moved to mercy by the goodness of a few innocent souls. The Responsorial Psalm (Ps 138), with the Psalm Response, "Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me," is a hymn of hope and trust in the Lord, reminding us that God is close to the humble of heart and to all those who call upon Him in their need. In the Gospel passage, after teaching a model prayer, Jesus instructs his disciples to pray to God their Heavenly Father with the same boldness, daring, intimacy, conviction, persistence and perseverance Abraham displayed and the friend in need in the parable employed. He gives us the assurance that God will not be irritated by our requests or unwilling to meet them with generosity. The parable in the gospel today reminds us of the necessity of perseverance in prayer as the expression of our total dependence on God. Persevering in prayer helps us to purify our prayer, to make clear to ourselves our values and hopes. and to lead us to ask for what is really in our very best interests. St. Paul tells us to "pray without ceasing" (Romans), "pray at all times" (Ephesians), "be steadfast in prayer" (Colossians), and "pray constantly" (Thessalonians). Jesus assures us, "Knock and the door shall be opened." We are to come before the throne of grace boldly and live Jordan, You revealed Him as every moment knowing that a loving, heavenly Your own Beloved Son. Father is on our side. He understands the problems Keep me, Your child, of our lives. This parable encourages us to persevere in prayer even when it appears to be unanswered. We live in a world where people give faithful to my calling. very little priority for prayer in the busy life. Most often we find people considering prayer as a futile as Your child through exercise, something done by people who have nothing else to do. In the midst of all that happens; of service to people. today's Gospel reading is an invitation to trust in the divine providence. It is about letting go of our resentments, our doubts and our fears. It is about Amen believing that nothing is going to happen to us that by His grace we cannot handle. To the unbeliever prayer is an exercise in futility. But to the believer, prayer is the most powerful and the most reliable force in the world today. God has promised to hear our prayers and so we need to believe that they will not go unanswered. Even though it sometimes seems that no one is listening, God is listening. He will answer our prayers in His own time and in His own way.
