Joseph's Decision: The Way of Love and Mercy

Mary was found to be with child. There had been a time when Jewish Law would have mandated that Mary be stoned to death for such a thing, and Joseph certainly knew this. Joseph had the option of bringing her before the elders. Joseph knew the consequences for Mary would be severe. This was the dilemma that Joseph had to wrestle with. The Bible said one thing, but his heart said another. In the end, Joseph chose the more merciful path. He decided to spare Mary the public disgrace and divorce her quietly. Divorce in those days was strictly a man's prerogative. It was relatively simple compared to today's standards. Joseph merely had to write a letter dismissing her from the betrothal contract and have two male witnesses sign it, attesting to the divorce. Mary then would be freed from the contract and be available to enter into a betrothal contract with another man. course, that would be a remote possibility, given that she was single and with child. But for Joseph, that was clearly the more merciful alternative. We might imagine it was not the best of times for him, as his world had been totally shaken. Perhaps he slept restlessly on his bed that night, agonising over the words to be written. And then there was the matter of trying to locate two discrete acquaintances to witness the document. We can surmise he was probably doing some tossing and turning that night. It was only after he had made his decision that he had his angelic visitation. The problem that Joseph faced is one that many of us have probably faced, at one time or another in our lives. The Bible is filled with rules and regulations. There are many laws and commandments, and at times we inevitably find ourselves in conflict with one or more of them. Often it seems that the letter of the law and the spirit of the law as we understand it, are different. Because of the complexity of Scripture, many tend to focus on specific verses to make one's case or another. The problem is worsened because we tend to read the ancient writings of the Bible with our twenty-first century lenses. Our contemporary values colour how we interpret what we read; we forget that different people in different times saw things in a much different way. Joseph knew what the scriptures said about Mary being pregnant. He knew the child wasn't his and therein lays the problem. He understood his rights and the legal consequences of her actions. But his heart spoke to him of love and of mercy and he chose the better way. The way of Christian faith for most of us has never been a bed of roses. Sometimes we find ourselves having to decide between the letter and the spirit of the law. Sometimes we get it right, and perhaps sometimes we get it wrong. But in our Gospel story this morning, we learn that Joseph got it right. It is interesting that the name Joseph translated from Hebrew into Latin means, "beyond reproach." There are times we'll all struggle trying to get it right. Life is just like that. But sometimes we have to let our heart speak to us in the quiet of the night. Those angels are still out there, with the words they've been called to speak. It is in the stillness of our loving hearts that we are best able to perceive their
