Following the Good Shepherd and Praying for Shepherds

Today we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday and World Day of Prayer for Vocations. We are reminded of our call to become good shepherds of God's flock and good sheep of His parishes. The Church today invites us to pray for vocations to the priesthood, the diaconate and the consecrated life. Both the Old and New Testaments use the image of a Shepherd and His flock to describe the unique relationship of God with Israel and of Christ with Christians. The first reading from St. Peter's first sermon, given on the day of Pentecost reminds his Jewish listeners that they have crucified their true Shepherd. Hence, they need to receive the forgiveness of their sin by getting baptized in the name of Jesus and acknowledging the risen Jesus as their Lord and Saviour, as Jesus had commanded. The Responsorial Psalm (Ps 23), introduces Yahweh as the Good Shepherd of Israel Who cares for His sheep, providing for their needs. In the second reading, Peter encourages the suffering Christians to follow in the footsteps of their Good Shepherd, Jesus, the "suffering servant," realizing the truth that Jesus' suffering and death have enabled them to become more fully the children of God.

Today's Gospel shows us Jesus as our unique gateway to eternal salvation ("sheep gate") and as a selfless, caring "shepherd" who provides his sheep protection

life itself.

Everyone who is entrusted with the care of others is a shepherd. Hence, priests, parents, teachers, doctors, nurses, government officials, and caregivers, among others, are all shepherds. We become good shepherds by loving those entrusted to us, praying for them, spending our time, talents and blessings for their welfare, and guarding them from physical and spiritual dangers. Parents must be especially careful of their duties toward their children, giving them good example and sound religious instruction. Above all, parents should pray for their children and infuse into them sound Christian moral principles. We need to pray for good priests and vocations. The Church uses this Sunday to encourage vocations to the ministerial priesthood, the diaconate and the consecrated life. All Christians share in the responsibility of fostering these vocations: a) The faith community must continuously pray for vocations both in the Church and in their families. b) Since good priests, deacons and people embracing the consecrated life come from good Christian families, all Christian parents need to live their faith in Christ on a daily basis by leading exemplary lives as parents and by fostering good relationships with, and among, their children. c) Parents need to respect and encourage a child who shows an interest in becoming a priest or deacon or of entering upon a consecrated life. Parents need to encourage their children, including their teenagers and young adults, to participate actively in the children's and youth activities in the parish, like children's clubs, and youth associations. They also need to encourage and actively support them in becoming altar servants, gift-bearers, lectors and ministers of hospitality. On this World Day of Prayer for Religious Vocations, let us begin, or continue, to pray for our priests, deacons and those living a consecrated life.

VINNIES WINTER APPEAL 2017

Together we can do heroic things

Firstly, the local conferences of St Vincent de Paul would like to acknowledge the continued contribution that, you, the parishioners, make to the ongoing local

operation of providing assistance to the needy in our area.

In the last year, the Modbury Conference made over 200 home visits in response

to calls for assistance, providing food, clothing, furniture and bills assistance as

needed. In addition, Christmas hampers were provided to over 40 families to lift their Christmas situation.

How do we do it?

There is the weekly provision of non-perishables that you deposit in the basket at the church door, that, some collected food from the warehouse at Wingfield,

bread from Baker's Delight at TTP, and two food appeals at St Francis Xavier's, Wynn Vale, reduces the amount of food we have to buy to keep our pantry stocked.

However, there was still an expenditure of about \$8000 to top up the non-perishables in the pantry, and covering vouchers we write on to the local shops for provision of fresh fruit, veg and meat.



The results clearly show us what you want the Renewal focus, and therefore the work of the Parish Pastoral Council, to be over the next couple of years. Accordingly, the next meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council will be entirely devoted to the topic of

Youth Involvement. We have decided to undertake some research into successful strategies for engaging young people and to that end have invited a range of groups to attend the meeting on 9th of May and to share with us how those groups meet the needs of young people and what makes them so successful. It is anticipated that our reflection and discussion of those ideas will lead us to devise some strategies to put into place in our parish soon.

The Parish Pastoral Council has asked the Liturgy Committee (which has now met three times) to take on the challenge of the second and third priorities listed above; Sunday Worship and Music Ministry. You may have been approached by a member of the Liturgy Committee asking you to reflect on the Lent and Easter Liturgies by completing a short survey. The survey was not distributed broadly. (They didn't want to overwhelm the parish
