You are the Salt; You are the Light

The only glimpse of Christ that most of the world sees is His reflection in the lives of His disciples. That is why the poet wrote the following words:

"We are the only Bible

The careless world will read,

We are the sinner's gospel

We are the scoffers creed;

We are the Lord's last message

Given in deed and word,

What if the type is crooked?

What if the print is blurred?" (Annie J. Flint, "The World's Bible")

The most difficult task a coach undertakes is to challenge his team that each player measures up to his or her full potential each game. Perhaps the most effective way to challenge an athlete is to honestly compliment him or her on what he or she can be if a full commitment is given. When Jesus declared, "You are the salt of the earth; You are the light of the world," He presented His disciples with the greatest challenge, as well as the highest compliment, that could ever be honestly extended to humans. Jesus Himself is "the light of the world" (Jn. 9:5). Thus, when He called us "the light of the world," He uttered the most generous compliment ever extended to humans. We are called to sustain the same relationship to the world that Jesus sustained and now sustains. This declaration from Jesus, at the same time is an important test as well, because it challenges us to live in the world in the same manner as He did. Salt and Light are eminently good in several ways. Christians must possess the same excellent qualities exhibited by salt and light. The goodness of salt is shown forth as it gives taste to food and preserves food items from getting spoiled. The goodness of light is first displayed in that fact it provides visibility. Without light, we cannot see anything. Without Christ and the Gospel, the world lies in spiritual darkness, void of any taste.

Disciples of Christ are like "A city that is set on a hill." All the world around us sees us and usually pays close attention to our example as a church, because they are aware of 'our claims to be God's chosen people. As an attacking enemy would view a fortified city from afar, looking for a weakness in its defence, the world views the church, looking for an excuse to call us hypocrites. Therefore, this gospel is an invitation to examine if there are any holes in the walls of our Christian living. "There can be no such thing as secret discipleship, for either the secrecy destroys the discipleship, or the discipleship destroys the secrecy" (William Barclay, The Gospel of Matthew, Vol. I, p. 119). Therefore, we should never be ashamed to be a disciple of Christ before our friends. It is often unpopular, at school, on the job and in public places to live above the views of the world. Thus, the gospel today challenges us that in all that we do before the world as Christians, whether in word or action, should tend to lead others to God.

Let us ask ourselves: Do we reflect Christ to the people around us in all that we say and do? Do we lead others to Christ by our example? "Let the light of our lives so shine before men, that they may see our good works, and glorify God who is in heaven."

Pastoral Care Visits

From time to time the chaplains and their teams who provide pastoral care at public hospitals become aware that a person who has been admitted to hospital has not shared this information at the local parish level (for various reasons). This means that ongoing pastoral care for that person may be easily overlooked, particularly when they are discharged from hospital. If you are to be admitted to hospital, perhaps let someone in the parish team know so that you will have an opportunity to be supported. If you choose, the parish can also share this information with the respective chaplain in advance so that one of the team can visit you during your stay.
