The days of Lent pass by quickly. It is already week two. For some the time has been marked with fidelity to those original Lenten intentions. For others, there was perhaps some backsliding, some slipping along the journey to Easter. That is normal, a part of the human condition. So much so, in fact, this second week of Lent comes forward to address the reality head on. The second week of Lent takes us back to Genesis, back to the beginning. Back to some situation of our ancestors in faith that shows how they too had to grow a great deal in faith. For them it was all the more difficult as they did not have the road map we call the Bible to help them along their way. That is why these Lenten readings are so important, they have been carefully selected and arranged to help us make our way together to Easter. We have the narration of transfiguration of Jesus, giving a glimpse of Jesus, the Son of God. The change that takes place in Jesus was not just physical. Not just a spectacle. This episode marked the beginning of a new phase in the life of Jesus. After the ascent to the mountain he would lead his disciples on the ascent to Jerusalem where he would suffer and die. It is as though Jesus is saying to us, "You have come this far now; walk with me a little longer in Lent. Let us finish the course."


