Happy Feast of the Most Holy Trinity

This is one of those Sundays in the Church calendar when well-intentioned clergy get into the pulpit and try to explain a Church doctrine that has baffled the greatest theological minds since the Third Century; the Doctrine of the Trinity. St. Augustine, one of the great Fathers of the Church, wrote 15 volumes that took over ten years to write on the Trinity. Theologians down through the ages have continued the process. The Doctrine of the Trinity is that big and central to Christian faith. You won't find the word Trinity or a definition for it in the scriptures, although the word was first used in its Greek form by Theophilus of Antioch around AD 180. From that time and down through the centuries it has enjoyed considerable study, dialogue, and even heated argument. The Church finally summarized its understanding of Trinity as well as the nature of the Incarnation in a creed, The Creed of Saint Athanasius.

The Doctrine of the Trinity is the central dogma of Christian theology, stating that the one God exists in three Persons and one substance, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God is one, yet self-differentiated; the God who reveals God's self to humanity is one God equally in three distinct modes of existence yet remains one through all eternity. When we speak of God as The Holy Trinity; when we refer to doctrines of the Trinity; when we worship God as Trinity; Father, Son and Holy Spirit; when we bless and greet and baptize people in the name of the triune God; we should do all this with great humility, realizing our God is so much more than all these words can ever express.

In the Trinity we have something very precious. We have the good news of the salvation for all people. We have the message concerning God's love and his desire to grant peace and wholeness to all his children. We have a light that shines into the darkness of human hearts and brings healing, a light that shines forth from there into the lives of those around us. It has seemed good to numerous generations of our spiritual ancestors to remember this truth on this particular day in a particular and special way, and so we do today.

Our gospel reading for today is the concluding verses of the Gospel of Matthew; in which we read about the Great Commission. This great commissioning is a general command: to "make disciples of all nations", baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Down through the centuries the Church is faithful to this command and that is the reason why we are able to celebrate this day here today. We're called to live as we pray, to put into practice what Triune God has come to reveal to us and make possible. And so, this Trinitarian Life that is emphasized and effectuated by the Sacraments is meant to overflow into our daily existence. Jesus has come to reveal to us who God is so that not only we may come to know him and experience his life and love each day and into eternity but so that we can also grow to know ourselves, who have been created by Him in His image and likeness.

Our church at Para Hills is named after the Holy Trinity and therefore, this celebration becomes very important to us. I wish you all a very Happy Feast of the Most Holy Trinity may we who bless ourselves in the name of the Triune God grow into that Trinitarian unity and love.
