

My Mother, My Brothers and Sisters

As Jesus became a strong critic of the Jewish religious authorities, His mother and cousins came to take Him to Nazareth by force, perhaps because they feared that Jesus would be arrested and put to death. Today's Gospel episode seems to suggest that Jesus ignored the request of His mother and close relatives who had travelled a long distance to talk to Him. But everyone in the audience knew that Jesus loved His mother and had taken care of her for thirty years.

Besides, Jesus' plain answer, "Whoever does the will of God is my brother, and sister, and mother" was actually a compliment to his mother who had always listened to the word of God and obeyed it. Jesus was declaring, "Blessed are those who hear and keep the word of God as she is faithfully doing" (Vatican II, Lumen Gentium, 58). Jesus was also using the occasion to teach the congregation a new lesson about their relationship with God. Being a disciple of Jesus, or a Christian, is first and foremost a relationship; a relationship of love and unity with God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and with all who belong to God as His children. Jesus has changed the order of relationships and shows us here that true kinship is not just a matter of flesh and blood. God's gracious gift to us is His adoption of us as His sons and daughters. This gift enables us to recognize all those who belong to Christ as our brothers and sisters. Our adoption as sons and daughters of God transforms all our relationships and requires a new order of loyalty to God and His kingdom. "Everyone who does the will of the Father, that is to say, who obeys Him, is a brother or sister of Christ, because he is like Him who fulfilled the will of His Father. But he who not only obeys but converts others, begets Christ in them, and thus becomes like the Mother of Christ" ("Commentary on St. Matthew", 12:49-50.)

Did Jesus have brothers and sisters? Catholic Church teaches that Jesus did not have blood brothers and sisters. After the birth of our Lord, although the Gospels do not give us many details of Jesus' childhood, no mention is made of Mary and Joseph ever having other children.

Never does it refer to the "sons of Mary" or "a son of Mary," but only the son of Mary. Shortly before the year 400, St. Jerome began to popularize the view that the brethren of Christ were cousins, and this view became common in the West. Nevertheless, the Catholic Church has faithfully taught that Mary gave birth only to Jesus, whom she had conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus is not diminishing the importance of His Mother. He is not saying work is more important than family. He is not disproving Catholic teaching that Mary remained a virgin throughout her life. Jesus is giving us the very good news that we are family. His family. Let us remember that by Baptism we become the children of God, brothers and sisters of Jesus and members of the Heavenly family of the Triune God. That we are brothers and sisters in Christ, members of God's family, has tremendous implications.

I can treat each person I encounter today as my brother or sister, assuming that God is the Father of this family, Mary is the mother, and Jesus is my role model brother.

Our family has golden rule standards all of us children are expected to live by; we are all loved unconditionally and we are expected to act like we are formed by that love to be part of our family's mission to form each person in that love. I know I am loved. I know how to treat each family member with caring and respect; even if they get on my nerves or overstep their bounds as brothers and sisters so often do.

Hence, let us observe our obligations of treating others with love and respect and of sharing our love with them in corporal and spiritual works of mercy. We are also His disciples, and so are obliged to be hearers as well as doers of the word of God.

Vicar General's Circular

Dear Sisters and Brothers,
The events of the last week have been profoundly disturbing, and I write to tell you that my heart and thoughts go out to you all.

Over the years I have spoken with many survivors of childhood abuse, some very close to me, and I have learnt that for most the impact of abuse never completely disappears, not for the whole of a lifetime. Every time the issue arises in public, painful memories and struggles rise to the surface again.

It is so important for us to be parishes, schools and communities where survivors are honoured, welcomed, listened to respectfully, and responded to with justice and care.

We are committed to be communities where every child is as safe as it is humanly possible to be.

That requires our skill and resources, along with our personal humility and love. It is why we ask so much of our ministers, workers and volunteers, and I am grateful that you are being so generous.

We also need to look forward.

Our life is focussed on the vision of the world God wants. That is a world where practical love and care is shown to those who are hurt or considered least, to those who are hungry and have little; where children are led to full and beautiful lives, and where God is known and loved.

This is our purpose. I have come to know so many of you personally and as communities. I know your goodness and commitment. We are servants of a vision that is greater than us, and now is the time for us to throw ourselves into that with all our hearts, to be the church God wants and work for the world God wants. It is not a time to falter in our commitment to care for all humanity, creation and one another.

May God who loves you with tender love, hold you in the very depths of God's heart,
