Strengthened by Jesus in Holy Communion

Congratulations to our Children who were confirmed on the 24th of July and are receiving First Holy Communion during these two weekends. You might have heard of Napoleon Bonaparte the French emperor who conquered most countries of Europe and wished to conquer the whole world. Somebody asked him a question. What is the most important day in your life. They expected answers like the day of his coronation as emperor, the day of his royal wedding, the day of his famous victories. But he said, "The most important and the most memorable day of my life is my First Communion Day." For each one of you this day should remain as the happiest and most memorable day of your life. Why is this the happiest day of your life? It is because you are receiving Jesus our God and Saviour, into your hearts and lives, for the first time, in Holy Communion. It means God is coming to stay with you, bless you, protect you and guide you. You have prepared well for this day and were waiting for this great occasion. You have studied hard about Jesus in Holy Communion. You have learnt and said your prayers. You have made your First Confession and now you receive the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. I pray that this day will be the beginning of a new and deeper friendship with Jesus for you. May you be filled with the joy that Saint Peter talks about in his letter when he says: "Although you have not seen Him, you love Him and even though you do not see Him now, you believe in Him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy." (1 Peter 1.8) Let us always remember that the day of First Holy Communion is not a completion but rather a beginning. It is the beginning of a new stage in Christian responsibility. As we receive Jesus in the sacrament we need to let Jesus act through us. We should think, speak and act like Jesus. It is not a once for all event. You need

to cherish this day in your memories and attend the Holy Mass as frequently as possible and receive the Lord in the Eucharist on a regular basis. You should grow in love for Jesus in the Eucharist and the Holy Mass celebrated in the community.

I invite all the children who receive their First Holy Communion these two weekends to be active participants in the celebrations that happen in our parish community. You can be part of the Altar servers group, the children's choir, junior legion etc., that will help you grow continuously in your faith.

Parents, this is a great day for you also. Today your children are fully nourished with you around the table of the Lord for the first time. Today your family is united in Jesus, the only one who nourishes us fully. When you had your children baptised you were reminded that you are their first teachers of their faith. They learned their faith from you before anybody else as you taught them to make the sign of the cross and to say their prayers.

During these early years, you have helped them so much to know about God. For many years to come what you say and do will influence their faith and their friendship with Jesus. No matter what the teacher, who is excellent, or parish does, unless the children sense their parents' faith they will not absorb faith. The faith you hand on will be their strength through life. Your family needs faith in God. It is not something they need only when there is a crisis. Teachers and priests cannot plant faith in the heart of your children if you do not. Congratulations that you have brought them this far into Christian initiation and I pray that you support them in their future journey of Christian faith as well.

Today is a very happy day for everybody else here and especially for the parish community because relations, friends, teachers, people of the parish have all watched these children grow and helped them on their friendship with God. I know you are praying for them today and will continue to pray for them.

I would like to thank everyone who prepared these boys and girls to receive their First Holy Communion and remind the parents of these children once again that it is how you live and how you practice your faith in the family that is going to influence your children. Hence continue to train them in Christian faith and its practice, not by advice but by exemplary Christian lives. God bless you.
