Christ the King: Beyond the Patterns of this World

We celebrate the Kingship of Christ but what sort of Kingship is it that we're celebrating? Our Gospel reading gives us a vivid picture to reflect on. The picture is certainly not what we would expect to see illustrating kingship, power and authority. There are no fine robes but a naked and scarred body. His crown has no jewels, only vicious thorns. On his hands there are no rings of power, just the nails which fix him to a wooden cross. There is no golden throne either. There are no courtiers or servants around him but just two criminals sharing his fate and an assorted crowd of soldiers and spectators who taunt and mock him.

But before we turn away from this grim picture of cruelty and humiliation, we see the words "This is the King of the Jews" and we hear the voice of an unlikely believer "remember me when you come into your kingdom". Someone here has caught a glimpse of the glory that is hidden by the awfulness of this torture. And we hear another voice, the voice of authority coming from the defeat of the cross, "Today you will be with me in Paradise". We heard the voices of mockery and hate. Now we hear the voices of faith and compassion, and it makes us stop and wonder.

Here is a King who is prepared to suffer alongside us. This is not a King who holds himself aloof from ordinary folk. This is a King who experiences betrayal, savage injustice, brutal cruelty, and utter humiliation and yet maintains his dignity and integrity. This is a King who has lived life as we live it, who has died as we must die but who now lives a new resurrection life. He reassures us and welcomes us into that same resurrection life in his Kingdom where we will know the peace and healing for which we have longed. The picture of Kingship in our

OUR PARISH WEBSITE: http://paramodcath.com.au ARCHDIOCESE WEBSITE: www.adelaide.catholic.org.au Gospel story turns traditional kingship upside down. It reaches out to us calling us to offer ourselves to Christ the King and we can perhaps sense what a difference this would make to our lives.

When it comes to any famous leader from history, for those interested in that leader, the natural question that seems to be foremost in everyone's mind is: what sort of person was that person? When it comes to Jesus, there are two further questions that have to be asked. The first of these questions is what do we mean when we think of Jesus being the king? The second question is rather more important. Assuming that Jesus is entitled to be thought of as king, how should that affect those who claim he is their king? In other words, how should it affect those calling themselves Christian?

Even if we only had that one incident to go by, the crucifixion with the ironic crown of thorns is a vivid reminder that Jesus' kingship was very different from what we usually mean when we talk of someone being a king. The gospel stories portray one who placed great store on humility, a Jesus who focused on offering service to others and on seeking justice and fair dealing for those often rejected by society. He didn't seem to care who he ate with or in whose company he was found. He ate with tax collectors and known sinners and talked with prostitutes. He appears to have had women in his inner circle despite the social conventions of a male-dominated society; and where no one was allowed within about five feet of lepers he apparently would touch such outcasts in his acts of healing. A king, Jesus may have been, but as John Dominic Crossan pointed out, Jesus was a king of nuisances and nobodies.

It was the need of cities or peoples for self-defence that gave rise to kings, and kings were for putting enemies under our feet. Kings were for war. Kings were for victory over evil. Is Christ a "king" then? Yes, we say, but not in the sense in which other kings are kings. Yes, we say, but in a different, higher, transcendental sense. Jesus, on the Cross, does the kingly thing par excellence. He doesn't have anyone crouching, licking dust at his feet. He forgives, he acquits, and he shows mercy. He is the universal King, as today's feast proclaims him. But what does this mean?

As soldiers of Christ, we should learn to fight with the same weapons used by our Master, the weapons of Truth, forgiveness and Love. As we leave this liturgical year, reflecting on the kingship of Jesus, let us imitate the example of Christ the King by being truthful, forgiving and loving. Being truthful even when we may incur loss, forgiving the very people we'd love to have crushed under our feet, loving the unlovely. For there, par excellence, Christ is King proclaimed through our lives.


Saint Ignatius' College, Junior School **Mary Glowrey Centre** (Tappeiner Gymnasium)
