After the hamper activity we suspend assistance calls until after Australia Day. Your support has enabled us to respond to almost 250 calls for assistance this year.

Last week we again took 5 calls for assistance, just less than the weekly average

REFLECTION

When people asked John the Baptist what they must do, he responded with examples, as Pope Francis points out, 'that are different for each group' and situation.

As the Pope indicates, the Baptist 'directs a specific word to each person that responds to their actual situation in life.' People with two garments should give one to those who have none. Those with food should share with those without. Tax collectors needed to be fair, soldiers to be restrained, and so on.

This specificity, the Pope reflects, 'offers us a precious teaching: faith is incarnated in concrete life. It is not an abstract theory.'

This Advent we might remember that we are called to practical service for the world. The Pope suggests that we should each consider: 'what can I do concretely during these days as we draw near to Christmas? How can I do my part?'

We might therefore turn our efforts to doing something, however small, to serve our Lord. With actions suited to our own time and place and situation, our faith should take on some 'concrete commitment', and in doing so bring a little bit more justice into the world.

There is the opportunity for children who have finished at least one year of school to participate in the gospel presentation of the Nativity of the Lord, according to the Gospel of Luke, as part of the Family Mass for Christmas being celebrated from 6:30p.m. on 24 December 2024 at Holy Trinity Church. The children need to be available for two practices, on Wednesday 18 December 2024 at 5:00pm for an hour and a quarter and then on Monday, 23 December 2024 at 5:00pm for about one hour.

At least one parent or guardian needs to stay for the practices; it is intended that this is a family friendly time! Only those children who have practised will be able to be in the gospel presentation.

Email Therese Meyers on pa@paramodcath.com.au by Monday 16 December 2024, providing the names of your children, their ages and whether they would be able to learn to read a part if required. Also indicate whether your child is inclined to be an angel, a shepherd, an innkeeper, a carpenter and/or a young woman.

Come to the practices with satisfied tummies!
Bring a drink bottle of water.

If interested in being an angel, strive to have an outfit that is white. The other roles involve simple, lightweight, long flowing outfits, tied around the waist and simple headwear draped over the head and/or around the shoulders and secured with a cord or headband and finished off with flat sandals. Any colour is suitable; recycle plain coloured or striped sheets that are worn in some areas and are ready to be cut down. Pinning bath towels at the shoulders is also easy. It may be warm so dressing gowns are less practical.

If there is a family who would like to have their newborn child as part of the gospel presentation, please email Therese.

There are other roles in the Mass that need be filled too; feel free to volunteer via the sign-up sheets at the back of the churches or let Therese know, eg. welcoming people and giving out the bulletins, reading prayers, Scripture, or commentary, procession of gifts, placing the figurine of Jesus in the Nativity set.
