A Christmas Message from our Parish Priest



Have you heard about the little boy who loved going to church? He enjoyed the music, the stained-glass windows, the homily and the sense of community. The only part about going to church that the little boy didn't like, was those long personal prayers which the priest added to the Universal Prayers!

Now when Christmas came around, the little boy's parents invited the priest home for lunch, and would you believe it, his Mum asked the priest to pray grace before the meal. "Oh, no," thought the little boy. "We will never get to eat. I'm starving and he'll pray on forever." But to his surprise, the priest's prayer was brief and to the point. He simply said, "Oh Lord, bless this home. Bless this food, and use us in your service, in Jesus' name. Amen."

Well, the little boy was so astonished by the priest's short prayer that he couldn't help himself. He looked at the priest and blurted out what he was thinking: "Man, you don't mess around when you're hungry!"

Well, I don't want to "mess around" on this Christmas morning because I know that whether we realise it or not ... we are hungry. We are all hungry for God. We are all hungry for our Saviour. We are all hungry for Christmas ... because, you see, this is precisely what Christmas is all about. We need a Saviour, we are starved for a Saviour, and that Saviour is given to us in Jesus. In fact, the name "Jesus" means literally "The Lord is Salvation," or Saviour.

So, my prayer is that you may experience the saving power of God this Christmas.

Merry Christmas everyone!

The calls keep coming – people are still needing assistance with food, clothing and bill assistance. We provide help through home visits and by assisting at the "Pooraka Hub" at the Holy Trinity hall. In the home visit area, we've hit 230 calls for the year to date.

This year, we packed Christmas hampers which included toys for children (via the Vinnies Warehouse from the MRA Toy Run), Vinnies Gift Cards for the adults and a Drakes gift card to enable some purchasing of perishables.

Our pantry and hamper situation was greatly boosted with a generous food donation from St Francis Xavier's School at Wynn Vale. We also have ongoing support from Baker's Delight and Pathway, which have allowed us to collect surplus bakery products fortnightly. The Vinnies Shop at Valley View has also been a valued contributor to our efforts.

Without your support, Vinnies wouldn't be able to cover the needs in our Conference area for either the hampers or home visits. The Vinnies volunteers are all happy to represent the Parish in their home visiting and other duties knowing they have your support.

Your support of the concert, the poor box, and the winter and Christmas appeals has bolstered our limited budget.

All being well, we'll resume home visiting to provide assistance after Australia Day.

PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL



Earlier this year, the PFC agreed to transfer management of the Parish Cash Book and finance processes to the Diocese Finance Office, at no cost to the Parish, to provide an upgraded reporting process in line with ATO requirements and to reduce workload on the office. This has taken a while to adjust to as we reorganise our budget lines to align with the Finance Office, which is now managing the finances for over 20 Parishes.

In general, while our planned giving amount for the year is down a bit, our expenditure to date is also lower than estimated, so we remain in the black for the time being.

In relation to the land sale, the person who bought the land from the Parish with the intention of building townhouses apparently is not able to progress those plans, so has now decided to sell the property. Therefore, it may be some time before we see any activity on the site. Irrespective of any development by the new owner, we will have some storm water drainage to address. That will occur once we know what the new owners intend to do, so we just have to wait and see.
