Parish Office and ask for the Parish Priest or Pastoral Associate to visit you.

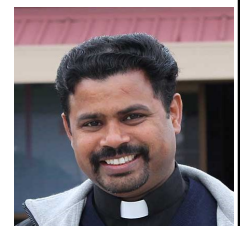
If you are a Parishioner already active in the parish "A Big Thank you".

**15th Sunday in Ordinary Time,
 Year A**

- Important to hear but then to act

'The key word today is 'hear'. It is a very scriptural word and contains essentially four elements:

- To *listen* with a totally open and unconditional mind ("Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God")
- to *understand* what one hears
- to *accept and appropriate fully* what one understands and, finally,
- this acceptance *flows out into our behaviour*.

One can listen but not understand and one can understand without accepting and one can accept without implementing. All four are necessary for conversion and healing. All four are necessary for full hearing.'
