“Lord You are my Greatest Treasure!”

Have you got something that is very precious to you? It might be something that isn't very important to anyone else, but is very special to you. Would you be willing to give it away or swap it? When you treasure something a lot, you usually are very careful with it. On this seventeenth Sunday Jesus Explains to us in the gospel that God's kingdom is like a priceless treasure that people would give their most precious possessions for. Jesus sees the search for God as integral in the journey of life that we are all involved in. We are all searching for the 'treasure' in our life. Identifying what is real treasure and then committing ourselves to it wholeheartedly is a challenge for all of us. The call of the Gospel is very clear as it tells us acquiring the kingdom of God involves paying the greatest price. Can you identify what price you have paid in order to follow Christ? What are you prepared to give up? What moments of delight in your life have pointed you towards the kingdom? Think about the things which you value most highly. Does this Gospel challenge your attitude to them? Make an effort this week to show in a special way how much you value your Christian commitment. Let us make all efforts that we find ourselves in the kingdom and the Lord Jesus will be our greatest treasure.



The Australian Christian Women's Association morning tea meeting was held on the 24th of July 2014 at Holy Trinity Church. Twenty people attended from all Christian Denominations. Previous President Rev Anita West addressed the meeting and special guest presenters were Margaret and Peter Roberts. The presentation was for "The Sam Roberts Family Fund". Sam died of a rare disease 10 years ago. A fund was started up for a special unit at the Women's and Children's hospital for parents and family to stay with their sick child. The Cycle 4 Sam committee have raised over \$500,000 and the future goal is to purchase and develop a holiday home, and to continue funding the Art Therapist and Therapist's for grief counselling beyond 2014. Sam's spirit continues through this fund and it is helping many families who have children in palliative care. \$219.00 was raised at this event. KIDS CORNER

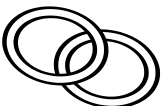
The Treasure in the field and pearls of great value, these two parables are about the kingdom of heaven.
