USE IT ALL.....

The miracle of the multiplication of the loaves where everyone is satisfied manifests God's bountiful goodness and kindness. When they all had enough to eat, he said to his disciples, "Gather the pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted." You have to like the efficiency of the task. Jesus did not want anything to go to waste. It is very natural to expect that after feeding 5000 people there would be a lot of leftover food. If that happens in our modern context we would probably try to save some of it, but realistically we would expect there to be a lot that would go to waste and would just figure that to be appropriate given the size of the group.

Even if we would have spent 3 days preparing food for the people and invested dozens of hours of our precious time into it, we would still be okay with some waste just thinking it comes with the territory of feeding this many people. When we read the gospel today we get a totally different idea.

Jesus treated this situation completely different: He didn't spend any time (from what we can tell) preparing it. If he had spent 3 days preparing it, it might make a little more sense if He said something like, "I just spent 3 days and thousands of dollars to get this food for you – therefore, I don't want any of it to go to waste. But instead, it was more like the bread continued to pour out of a never-ending basket. Even though waste should have been expected (for a crowd of 5000) He made sure there wasn't any. If I were one of the disciples I probably would have thought to myself, "Why are we picking up these scraps? He just created thousands of loaves and fish out of thin air – do we really need the leftovers? Can't He do it again if the situation demands more bread for tomorrow or any day?" Clearly the Lord was trying to make a point.

Have we noticed in our own life that when we have more, we care less about wasting stuff? Today's gospel tells us that regardless of how things are going financially don't let go to waste what God has blessed. What he has given you and multiplied through his blessing, put it to good use. Use it all.

It is a bit easier when money is tight, but when things are going better it can be really difficult to care about the "small change". But clearly the Lord wants us to minimize waste whether we have to work hard for the excess or whether it comes easily.

Gospel John: 1-15

This story is about a miracle. If you don't know what a miracle is, you should by the end of this story. Just remember only God can do miracles, and He still does them today! It was starting to get late in the day and none of the people had supper yet. The disciples came to Jesus and said, "There is no food around here and it's already getting late. Maybe we should send the people away so they can go to the surrounding towns and get themselves something to eat."



Jesus replied, "You give them something to eat." The disciples didn't think that they understood Jesus right, "We can't feed all these people, we would have to work almost a year to pay for all the food." The disciples said shocked.

"Here is a boy with five small loaves of bread and two small fish, but how far will they go among so many people?"

Jesus smiled and said, "Ask everyone to sit down." There was lots of grass to sit on so everyone was seated, all five thousand of them.

After everyone was seated Jesus took the loaves of bread and thanked God for it. Then the disciples passed around the bread and everyone could take as much as they wanted.
