The Widow's Mite

Today's readings invite us to live out a total commitment to God's service with a humble and generous heart, free from pride and prejudice. The first reading and the Gospel today present poor widows who sacrificially gave their whole lives and means of livelihood to God, symbolising the supreme sacrifice Jesus would offer by giving His life for others. In the reading from the First Book of Kings, a poor widow who has barely enough food for herself and her son welcomes the prophet Elijah as a man of God, shares her food with him. In the Gospel, Jesus contrasts the external signs of honour sought by the scribes with the humble, sacrificial offering of a poor widow and declares that she has found true honour in God's eyes. The poor widows in both the first reading and the Gospel gave away all that they possessed for the glory of God.

Beginning from chapter 11 of Mark's Gospel, Jesus confronts the Temple authorities and challenges the abuses in the "organised religion" of his time. One by one he engages in debate with the Sadducees, the Pharisees, the scribes, and the Herodians. Today's Gospel text demonstrates why all those who held traditional positions of religious power found Jesus' presence and preaching so disturbina.

It was not the woman's poverty that made her gift significant for Jesus. For him, it was the fact that this widow, alone among all the contributors lined up to give their offerings, gave her all. The very rich put in much, and the moderately well-off put in a decent amount. But all those who had gone before this widow had limited their giving by holding back a major portion of their money for their own use. This widow stood alone as the one who had turned over, as an offering to God for His use, everything she had. Those two, almost worthless coins represented her last shred of security, her fragile earthly thread of hope for the future. With her deep desire to be an obedient servant of God, the widow gave all she had as an offering, even her future, for the sake of God. In other words, she gave herself totally into God's hands, with the sure conviction that He would give her the support she needed. The simple piety of this woman of no social standing is contrasted with the arrogance and social ambitions of some so-called religious leaders. This poor woman, in a daring act of trust in God's providence, put into the treasury everything she had. Her action symbolised what Jesus would do by offering his very life to God his Father as an act of perfect obedience.

Let us learn to appreciate the widows and widowers of our parish community. Their loneliness draws them closer to God and to stewardship in the parish. They are often active participants in all the liturgical celebrations, offering prayers for their families and for their parish family. Frequently, they are active in the parish organisations, as well as in visiting and serving the sick and the shut-ins. Hence, let us appreciate them, support them, encourage them and pray for them. Secondly, the offering God wants from us is not our material possessions, but our hearts and lives. Can we, like the poor widow, find the courage to share the wealth and talents we hold? Can we stop dribbling out our stores of love and selflessness and sacrifice and compassion and dare to pour out our whole heart, our whole being, our "whole life" into the love-starved areas of this world?



Already, at week 40 in 2018, the Modbury Conference had over 220 requests for assistance that we've met by providing food and shop vouchers, Vinnies Shop vouchers for clothing and Manchester, and furniture when available from the Wingfield warehouse. We again aim to provide about 40 families with Christmas hampers and toys from the MRA Toy Run. For most of these hamper contents we rely on your generosity through the Giving Tree and from St. Francis Xavier's Catholic School at Wynn Vale. Week to week, we rely on your support through the perishable food hamper donations, and we top up our pantry by purchasing from Foodland. We also purchase Foodland Gift Cards, so that our recipients can purchase fresh food items. Unfortunately, it all takes money. Our fund raising encompasses the Poor Box, the Concert, the People's Choice Credit Union Raffle, and the Winter and Christmas Appeals and general donations from the Reach Out and Craft Groups etc. Our shortfall in funds has to come from State Council, where the CEO Sleep out funds are managed. This weekend is the designated time for the Christmas Appeal, and again we seek your financial support. We'll provide the envelopes and will follow up with receipts. Whatever you can contribute will be greatly appreciated.

We hope you can continue with your strong support in the assured knowledge that the funds are well spent on true charity. **And please**; As our number of active volunteers decreases, as age illness and relocation all take their toll, and we need new members to step up and carry on the tradition.

There's not a lot involved; a monthly meeting and the ability to make home visits (in pairs) usually at the rate of about once a week, and accepting the Vinnies ethos. Please contact any of the Vinnies members, or come along to a meeting, or send someone else along, and you'll be most welcome.
