#### **Live Your Faith**



In the late 1990's, CNN, the American news channel, ran an ad in the print media that made a deep impression on me: not necessarily to watch CNN; which, of course, I do sometimes, but about the spirituality of daily life. The ad had this large truck in the foreground which was on fire. At one of the corners of the photograph there was this elderly person who was throwing a bucket of water on the blazing truck in an attempt to put out the fire. And the caption read: "History is not made by kings and presidents; but by ordinary people doing extraordinary things."

The Liturgy of the Word on this 27th Sunday of Ordinary Time invites us to reflect on the sacredness of our daily

lives. It calls us to find God in our faithfulness to daily duties. To the apostle's request for more faith, Jesus replies that it is the quality, rather than quantity, of faith that needs revitalizing. In the context of the word of God today I would like to invite you to reflect on the spirituality of daily life, the spirituality of faith expressed in daily living, or the spirituality of ordinary things – a spirituality that is at the heart of the religious order that I belong to: the Missionaries of St. Francis De Sales.

We are called, 'Fransalians' in honour of the French Saint, Francis de Sales (1567-1622), who believed that all Christians are called to a life of holiness according to their state of life. And holiness consists in the fulfilment of our duties with a great devotion. Much before the 2nd Vatican Council that called all Christians to a life of holiness, St Francis would write to 'Philothea', in his classical, An Introduction to the Devout Life: "It is not merely an error but a heresy to suppose that a devout life (holiness) is necessarily banished from the soldier's camp, the merchant's shop, the prince's court, or the domestic hearth" (Chap. III).

How can I live the spirituality of daily life?

The gospel text of today begins with the request of the apostles to Jesus: "Increase our faith." And Jesus replies, "If you had faith like a mustard seed you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea', and it would obey you" (Lk 17:5-6). Often people quote these lines implying that if you had enough faith you could perform a show of miracles. This could well be the case. However, in the lines that follow

(Lk 17:7-10) Jesus seems to imply something else. He talks about the fulfilment of duties. So, is Jesus saying, if we had faith like a mustard seed our ordinary activities of daily life could become extraordinary? I tend to think so.

Today we need to take hold of the truth that we do have faith; we already have the gift of faith given to us at Baptism and Confirmation and nourished by the Holy Eucharist and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Jesus is telling us that we should rely more on the faith we have already been given. If we would only dare to use this faith we will experience amazing things happen in our lives and we'll see God's will be accomplished through us. Here we have the first clue on how we can move towards holiness: add a little bit of faith to the fulfilment of our daily duties. When we add faith to our daily work, we begin to participate in the creative and redemptive work of God. Everything in this world will become a possibility when people do believe and act according to what they believe.

We live in a world where many things like world peace, love among people without boundaries, harmony among nations etc., are considered impossibilities. Surely, peace on earth is possible, love among people on earth is possible and harmony among nations is possible. They are possible if we believe that it will happen. Through faith the power of God is active among us and so nothing will be impossible. Yes, it is a matter of vision and faith.

The important question is: Do you believe and do you bring that faith into the ordinary activities of your daily living? Ultimately what counts most is not the number of rosaries we have recited, not the number of holy places and shrines we have visited, not the number of pilgrimages we have undertaken, but rather the faith and trust in the Lord with which we have fulfilled our daily duties by raising our minds and hearts to God.

# **Meet Your Fellow Parishioners**

Meet Pat Cherry, a long time parishioner who Proclaims The Word, volunteers as a Church cleaner, is a member of the Legion of Mary and is over 90 years young! This is her story....

I came to live in Para Hills almost 50 years ago when I married my late dear husband, John Cherry, who died on the 18th March this year.

I was born in Adelaide, the youngest of five children, to an English mother and an Australian father. My family lived on the south side of Adelaide and I attended



Catholic schools in the days when all the teachers were either nuns, brothers or priests. Although my parents were good and faithful Catholics, I received most of my Catholic education from the nuns at school.

We lived on the Main South Road, Clovelly Park, and in my early days that area was quite country-like. We used to walk across paddocks to Colonel Light Gardens, a distance of about 2 miles, to attend Mass on Sundays at the Colonel Light Gardens parish. My parents never owned a car.

Of the five children in our family, four were girls and my only bother Francis, left home at a very early age and went to Sydney to join the Marist Brothers, one sister entered the Dominican Convent at North Adelaide and my other two sisters married good, Catholic husbands, leaving me to carry on into spinsterhood until I met the love of my life, John Cherry, who had come to Australia for a 2 year holiday. His 2 year holiday became a 50 year happy marriage for both of us.

When we came to live in Para Hills in October 1969 Holy Trinity Church was part of the Salisbury parish and the priest came from Salisbury to say Mass. Para Hills and Modbury became one parish in 2004.

In the very early days, before the church was built, Mass was offered in the Para Hills Pool hall where the Para Hills Community Hub now stands.

On the southern side of the church, where the car park is now, there was a temporary building which was used for catechism classes and social events. The parish centre was added to the church in 1985.

John attended Mass with me on most Sundays although he was not a Catholic at that time. He was received into the Church on the 5th of April 2013 when he was confirmed and received his first Holy Communion from Father Peter Milburn.

There have been many changes in our parish community since those early days with many people from overseas coming to live in the area.
