# Lent: God is not Interested in Our Art but, Our Heart

"No act of virtue can be great if it is not followed by advantage for others. So, no matter how much time you spend fasting, no matter how much you sleep on a hard floor and eat ashes and sigh continually, if you do no good to others, you do nothing great," is a wonderful quote often used during the season of Lent. We live in a world filled with restlessness. Life's demands often come upon us at a fast and furious pace. Living with the realities of war, poverty, terrorism, political unrest, economic and natural disasters in different parts of the world, we are a people wearied by life. In the midst of all these challenges, the Church offers us a precious gift: the season of Lent. It is a sacred space, a time beckoning us to pause, draw back from life's daily grind, and dwell more deeply on Jesus' story of our salvation: his life, passion, and resurrection through fasting, prayer and almsgiving.

Lent is a special time for prayer and reflection. By praying the Lenten Scriptures

and partaking daily in the Eucharist, we open ourselves to the great mercy of God, manifested in Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. The fruit of time spent in prayer and reflection should be a deeper connection with God, oneself, our neighbour, and the poor in particular. In a restless world of discord and disconnection, Lent should help us to deepen our discipleship with Christ and better live our Christian vocation. The Lenten Gospels portray Jesus as always fervently doing the Father's will. By his prayer and in his Passion, Jesus always remained connected to God. Our faith challenges us to be connected to God and to one another by obeying Jesus'

command to love God and serve our neighbour more profoundly. Lent is a special time that calls us to

examine more clearly the presence of the suffering Christ in the world so that we might understand their plight and be Christ to them.

Lent is a time for action. Lenten season reminds us that the suffering Christ in his Passion is present in our world in countless ways. As disciples of Jesus, it is our task to act on their behalf. "Whatever you did for the least of my brethren, you did to me." (Mt. 25:40) It is our task, both individually and collectively as Christians to respond in love and service.

In Lent and throughout this year, we have the

opportunity to grow in our faith by reflecting on God's Word and partaking in the Eucharist which deepens our bonds of connection in service of the poor. Let us pray that we may be able to die to ourselves in order to rise with Him, that He may be the joy of our heart, the end and soul of our actions, and our glory in heaven.

This will become a reality if we humble ourselves as He humbled Himself, if we renounce our own satisfaction to follow Him by carrying our little crosses, and if we give our lives willingly, as He gave His for our neighbour whom he loves and whom he wants us to love as ourselves.

Our restless world can seem at times to be

overwhelming. But our faith in Jesus provides us with renewal, strength, and confidence to face the future with hope. Let us pray that this Lent will be a time when God's grace and goodness may be more fully

manifested in our lives and in the lives of all with whom we live. May this Lenten practice help us to begin a

habit of daily scripture reading and prayer, stimulate our present prayer life, or renew an old practice that we may have neglected. Yes, dear brothers and sisters, this is a wonderful opportunity for us to begin all over again.

Together we shall journey from the ashes of Ash Wednesday to the flames of the new paschal fire.

We shall journey with Jesus as He leads us through the Paschal Mystery of His death and Resurrection.

We shall pray for one another as we walk together with Jesus to the new life He promised us.


The Stational Mass is also an opportunity to present candidates, already baptised, who are seeking full communion with the Catholic Church.
