Happy Easter:
Life Never Ends and Love Never Dies

My dear Parishioners,

Let me first and foremost wish you a HAPPY EASTER. May the fullness of life given to us through the resurrection of Jesus be with you always. Easter is the greatest and the most important feast in the Church for three reasons. Firstly, the Resurrection of Christ is the basis of our Christian Faith. It is the greatest of the miracles, for it proves that Jesus is God. That is why St. Paul writes: "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain; and your faith is in vain" (I Cor 15: 14), "Jesus is Lord. He is risen!" (Rom 10:9). was the central theme of the preaching of the apostles. Secondly, Easter is the guarantee of our own resurrection. Jesus assured Martha at the tomb of Lazarus: "I am the Resurrection and the life: whoever believes in me will live even though he dies" (Jn 11:25-26).

Thirdly, Easter is a feast which gives us hope and encouragement in this world of pain, sorrows and tears. It reminds us that life is worth living. It is our belief in the Real Presence of the Risen Jesus in our souls, in His Church, in the Blessed Sacrament and in Heaven that gives meaning to our personal as well as our communal prayer, strength to fight against temptations and freedom from unnecessary worries and fears. As we celebrate Easter 2020, finally the world is united. We are united in fear of what tomorrow will bring, of not knowing if our societies will withstand the devastating impact of the Coronavirus pandemic. Even though we are celebrating Easter, the festival of life, still we feel as though we are in the garden of Gethsemane with the disciples and our faith is being badly shaken. Many of us are suffering and are almost feeling helpless. The pandemic is making the suffering of vulnerable

The pandemic is making the suffering of vulnerable people; migrants and refugees, the elderly, the sick, the poor and unemployed even deeper. We pray that our leaders rise to the challenge of promoting unity and a shared responsibility in all of our countries.

In the midst of loss, uncertainty and suffering, something incredible is happening: we are noticing the bonds which form our human family. Bonds that we previously took for granted or ignored. As we live in isolation and we all become marginalised and vulnerable, the global suffering we are seeing has made it startlingly apparent to us that we need other people and other people need us too. It is as though the stone that covers the tomb is slowly being

rolled back to allow a light of recognition. This light heralds Easter and the Risen Christ. There are also, changes that would have been unthinkable three months ago actually happening: air quality has improved in a number of countries and warring parties in some others have called ceasefires. These may be temporary, but they remind us that seemingly irresolvable human problems aren't eternal. We are reminded that Jesus stayed in the tomb for a brief time before rising to eternal life. Death does not have the final say when you make space for hope.

I feel immense gratitude towards all those who trustingly open their hearts and give themselves fully to bring the lights of love and hope into people's lives at this dark time. The health care workers and all those leaders who plan for a lasting solution to bring humanity out of the power of pandemic and all those who by sharing what they own, however small they be, bring comfort into the life of those who suffer and are in difficulties are in my prayers as our communities face this enormous challenge. All of YOU my dear parishioners, thank you very much for keeping the parish and supporting the needs of the parish as one of your priorities. I thank God for the gift of each of you and pray that God continue to shine in your lives with love, peace, joy and fullness of life. May God keep you safe. The answer to this crisis lies in all of us and in our unity.

As people around the world face Easter without the possibility of physical communion, without the possibility of celebrating the Eucharist physically together, we have a time of slow down where we can reflect deeply on what "Body of Christ" means for each of us. In the darkness of this crisis, the light of Christ will shine. Jesus is truly risen! He will not die again. May Jesus rise for people around the world through our love!

Yes, Easter gives us the joyful message that we are a "Resurrection people." This means that we are not supposed to lie buried in the tomb of despair, discouragement, or doubts. Instead, we are expected to live a joyful and peaceful life, constantly experiencing the living presence of the Risen Lord in all the events of our lives and even amidst the boredom, suffering, pain and tensions of our day-to-day life. Our awareness of the all-pervading presence of the Risen Lord in and around us, and the strong conviction of our own resurrection should help us to control our thoughts, desires, words and behaviour. Our conviction about the presence of the Risen Lord in our neighbours and in all those with whom we come into contact should encourage us to respect them, and to render them loving, humble and selfless service. We need to become transparent Christians witnessing the love of Christ by showing others through our lives the love, mercy, compassion and spirit of self-sacrificing service of the Risen Jesus living in our hearts. Let us then, live lives of love in the power of Jesus' Resurrection as we celebrate Easter in the difficult circumstances this year. Let us pray for the serenity to accept the things we cannot change, the courage to change the things we can and the wisdom to know the difference. Let us pray to find the deeper meaning of this challenge that is facing the whole of humanity and which is calling us to faith and to resurrection.

Once again, I wish you all an Easter full of life, love and peace.

#### **COVID-19 PHONE COUNSELLING** NOW AVAILABLE BY APPOINTMENT

People struggling to cope with the chaos and fear surrounding COVID-19 can now access free phone counselling by appointment from Centacare Catholic Family Services.

In response to the health emergency, Centacare has increased capacity to provide telephone support for mental health concerns, family stress due to job loss, social isolation and other challenges arising from the coronavirus pandemic.

People do not need a mental health care plan to access the short-term support. Rather, they can phone Centacare direct and book an appointment for a telephone counselling consultation.
