Coronavirus Protocols

With the easing of some restrictions we will be resuming Masses from Monday 1st June. Please see below for times. At this time we are required to limit the number of parishioners to 20 at St John XXIII

When attending Mass you will be required to

- Provide your full name and a contact phone number to assist in contact tracing. A sign in sheet will be provided before Mass begins.
- Practice social distancing, by remaining at least 1.5metres from each other. To assist with this some pews at Holy Trinity will be blocked off and at St John XXIII only the required amount of chairs will be placed.
 We ask that you do not move chairs.
- Practice good hand and respiratory hygiene. Hand sanitiser will be available at the entrance of the Churches.
- Limit your movements within the Church as much as possible.

If you need to enter any of the Parish buildings outside of Mass please fill in the sign in sheets provided which will assist with contact tracing if required.

Our priority at this time is to continue to minimise the risk of spreading the Coronavirus in our community. If you have flu like symptoms or are feeling unwell please do not attend Masses.

Strengthened by the Holy Spirit: Pentecost

Today the church celebrates the feast of Pentecost, the feast of the Holy Spirit. Both the Jews and the Christians now celebrate Pentecost, though not for the same reasons. Along with the Feast of the Passover and the Feast of Tabernacles, Pentecost was one of the major feasts of the Chosen People. The word Pentecost is Greek for pentecostes which means "fiftieth." The feast received this name because it was celebrated fifty days after the Feast of the Passover. Another name for the Jewish Pentecost is Shebuot or "The Feast of Weeks "(the "week" of seven Sabbaths between Passover and Pentecost, in thanksgiving for the Passover freeing of the Chosen People from Egyptian slavery and their return to the Promised Land). Originally, this feast was a thanksgiving festival for the completion of the harvest. Later, the Jews added to the Feast of Pentecost the element of Yahweh's Covenant with Noah, which took place fifty days after the great deluge. Still later, they made this feast an occasion to thank God for His Sinaitic Covenant with Moses, which occurred fifty days after the beginning of the Exodus from Egypt. For Christians, Pentecost marks the end and the goal of the Easter season. It is a memorial of the day the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles and the Virgin Mary in the form of fiery tongues, an event that took place fifty days after the Resurrection of Jesus. The Paschal mystery: The Passion, the Death, the Resurrection, and the Ascension of Jesus; culminates in the sending of the Holy Spirit on Jesus' disciples. The feast also commemorates the official inauguration of the Christian Church with the apostolic preaching of St. Peter, which resulted in the conversion of 3000 Jews to the Christian Faith. Pentecost is, thus, the official birthday of the Church. Today when we ponder on the gift of the Holy Spirit into the life of each one of us it is a big question to ask whether we have let the Holy Spirit control our lives or let something else to take control of us. I often think that the disciples in that Upper Room, after the Ascension and before Pentecost, held a long, long Pastoral Council Meeting. The task had been assigned. They were to go into the whole world telling about the Good News of the Resurrection, baptizing those who believed. They were to be "witnesses." It's a pity we don't know what they talked about at that first meeting:

- The accounts were in disarray after Judas had gone.
- Someone must have said that there was no way they could afford to go into the entire world.
- Someone else may have suggested that it was dangerous to go outside the Upper Room. They were the chosen: Who would do the work if they were killed or thrown in prison?
- Perhaps another disciple said that they were no good at evangelisation, or they were too old, too tired, too poorly educated to speak of what moves them towards God.

The Upper Room must have felt so safe, so comfortable. And then something extraordinary happened. They were all attacked by what seemed to be wind and fire, the ancient symbols of God's presence. That energy, that being set on fire with confidence, thrust them out into the street, where they were soon accused of being drunk at ten o'clock in the morning. As we read in the Gospel, all this had been promised, that the Holy Spirit would be received. All those fears and doubts, all those reasonable objections to Jesus' command evaporated. The Church was on the move. The Church was intended to be on the move. It was not intended for Upper Rooms. It was intended for the street, for people, and places everywhere.

The Holy Spirit wasn't given so individuals could have a form of "spirituality" just for them. Holy Spirit wasn't given to an elite group so that they could practice a religion close to their political opinions, left, right, or centre. The Holy Spirit was given to the Church to enable it to be the Church. In the power of the Spirit, the Church is enabled to put things together and to be together. The Holy Spirit doesn't guarantee that the decisions we make together are wise or good. The Holy Spirit guarantees that the Church and the Church's mission will go on and on until kingdom come. It is the truth of kingdom which is, and is to come, into which the Spirit leads us. The Spirit was involved in Jesus' conception as a human being and in Jesus' baptism, anointing, temptation, teaching, miracles, death, and resurrection.

Since Pentecost, the Holy Spirit has, in His fullness, indwelt all believers, illuminating their understanding and application of God's Word as well as empowering them for sanctification.

Holy Spirit fills them, seals them, communes with them, fellowships with them, intercedes for them, comforts them, admonishes them, sanctifies them, and enables them to resist sin and to serve God.

As Christians every one of us is to be controlled by the Holy Spirit. Rom 8:9, You, (CHRISTIAN) however, are controlled not by the sinful nature but by the Spirit, if the Spirit of God lives in you. And if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to Christ.

We need to be Spirit-filled Christians who acknowledge our weaknesses, asking for the strengthening, anointing and guidance of the Holy Spirit every day. Let us repeat St. John Henry Cardinal Newman's favourite little prayer,

"Come Holy Spirit:"


