Coronavirus Protocols

With the easing of some restrictions, Masses have now resumed.

At this time we are required to limit the number of parishioners to 20 at St John XXIII

and 28 at Holy Trinity (20 in the Church and 8 in the Cry Room)

To help regulate the numbers parishioners will need to book in for all Masses.

You will only be able to book for yourself and your immediate household members.

When attending Mass you will be required to

- Provide your full name and a contact phone number to assist in contact tracing. A sign in sheet will be provided before Mass begins.
- Practice social distancing, by remaining at least 1.5metres from each other. To assist with this some pews at Holy Trinity will be blocked off and at St John XXIII only the required amount of chairs will be placed.
 We ask that you do not move chairs.
- Practice good hand and respiratory hygiene. Hand sanitiser will be available at the entrance of the Churches.
- Limit your movements within the Church as much as possible.

If you need to enter any of the Parish buildings outside of Mass please fill in the sign in sheets provided which will assist with contact tracing if required.

Our priority at this time is to continue to minimise the risk of spreading the Coronavirus in our community. If you have flu like symptoms or are feeling unwell please do not attend Masses.

We greatly appreciate your continuing cooperation during this difficult time.

My dear Sisters and Brothers,
Fraternal greetings to you from Fr. Benny Koottanal MSFS, Provincial of the South West India Province of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales. I had the great privilege of visiting you in your parish a couple of years ago. Although a visitation to Australia was planned in the month of May 2020,

it had to be cancelled due to the pandemic. Please be assured that you are always in my prayers. Let the Spirit of God guide you and your families with positivity and unity especially at this time of struggles and difficulties.

My Sisters and Brothers, this time of the pandemic should become also a time of creative reflections and discernments in our lives. In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit



Today's feast invites us to live in the awareness of the presence of the Triune God within us; the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The mystery of the Holy Trinity, a doctrine articulated by the ecumenical councils of Nicaea and Constantinople, is one of the fundamental doctrines of Christianity and the greatest mystery of our Faith. "There is one God, Who has three Persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Each Person is God, yet there is still only one God" (CCC #234, #253-256). God the Father Who is the Creator, the Son, the Redeemer and the Holy Spirit, the Sanctifier and the Counsellor. The doctrine of Three Persons in one God, co-equal and co-eternal in Divinity yet distinct in Person, is not explicitly spelt out in the Bible. Even the very word "Trinity" is not found in the Bible. But the doctrine of the Trinity underlies all major Christian feasts, including Christmas, the Epiphany, Good Friday,

Easter, the Ascension and Pentecost. All the official prayers of the Church, including the Holy Mass and the Sacraments, begin with an address to the Holy Trinity: "In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." We are baptized, absolved of our sins and anointed in the name of the Blessed Trinity. We bless ourselves with the Sign of the Cross, invoking the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and we conclude our prayers glorifying the Holy Trinity, saying "Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit." Today's readings convey the fundamental mystery that the Triune God reaches out to people with love, seeking the deepest communion with them.

The feast of the Holy Trinity is very special to us as members of the Para Hills Modbury Catholic parish. Our mass centre at Para Hills was named Holy Trinity Church when it was built. We are grateful to God for this house of prayer in the name of the Triune God. I would like to wish all parishioners a very Happy Feast of the Holy Trinity. We who are named after Holy Trinity must see the Trinity as the model for our Christian Community. We are created in love to be a community of loving persons, just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are united in Love. From the day of our Baptism, we have belonged to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. How privileged we are to grow up in such a beautiful Family! Hence, let us turn to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit in prayer every day. We belong to the Family (community) of the Triune God. The love, unity and joy in the relationship among the Father, Son and Holy Spirit should be the supreme model of our relationships within our Christian families and in our community. Our community becomes truly Christian when we live in a relationship of love with God and with others. The celebration of Trinity Sunday in our community should help us to respect ourselves and respect others. Our conviction of the presence of the Triune God within us and within our community should help us to esteem ourselves as God's holy dwelling place, to behave well in His holy presence, and to lead purer and holier lives, practicing acts of justice and charity. This Triune Presence should also encourage us to respect and honour others as God's dwelling place. May God bless us all in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

We would like to once again thank all of our parishioners who have continued to financially support us during the last couple of months as this has greatly helped our finances.




COVID-19 PHONE COUNSELLING NOW AVAILABLE BY APPOINTMENT
