Lent: A Time for Self-Renewal

In today's gospel, Jesus is trying to draw his hearers into the middle of things. Rather than looking on, and debating why this is happening, or why that happened, he asks them to look at themselves, at their own situation, and become more concerned with what's happening or not happening there. He uses an illustration to show them how many chances they are getting, how patient and tolerant God is with them. He goes on to say that this will not go on indefinitely, and that, sooner or later, they must be responsible, or else they will be held responsible for what they have done, and for what they have failed to do.

We may feel a little uncomfortable when we hear today's gospel. I sure am! I prefer "Comforter Jesus, "Peace Jesus," "Good Shepherd Jesus," "Jesus loves me Jesus." UNLESS YOU REPENT, YOU WILL ALL PERISH JUST AS THEY DID! is not the Jesus I like to think about. Jesus is making us uncomfortable.

It is good to ask today where do I find myself in this scripture? Am I one of the followers who is rushing to tell Jesus about the Galileans whom Pilate has killed while they were worshipping? Am I trying to figure out why, looking to Jesus to make some sense of these tragedies? Am I one of those trying to figure out if there is something about me and my loved ones who "deserve" to not be a victim of such tragedies? Maybe I am... but listen again to Jesus' response. UNLESS YOU REPENT, YOU WILL ALL PERISH JUST AS THEY DID! He says it twice, so it must be important. Are you feeling uneasy again? I am. That's not the response I want, but maybe, just maybe it's the response I need to hear.

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Jesus asks, "Do you think that these Galileans suffered in this way because they were worse sinners than all other Galileans?" "Do you think they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? No, I tell you." "But unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did." We must all examine our lives. Because the reality is that we are like all these people. Sometimes we will suffer when we have done nothing to deserve it. Sometimes we will stand up for what is right in the face of opposition. And sometimes we will be the oppressors, the ones who hurt others, all the time believing that we are better than them.

Thankfully, Luke moves us from Jesus the demanding one to Jesus the Comforter, the gardener. Today's gospel speaks about a fig tree that did not produce fruit. Producing fruit was the whole reason and purpose of it being planted in the first place. God gives me nothing for myself. He doesn't give me my gift of speech to go around talking to myself! As a Christian, I am called into the service of others. It is in giving that I receive. There are three groups in every society. There is a small group that cause things to happen. There is a larger group that watch things happening. And then there's the largest group who haven't a clue what's happening! Christianity is more about walking the walk than talking the talk. It is about action, and not just ideas.

Christianity is about walking the walk, and not just about talking the talk. Faith is not some sort of mental concept up in my head, like, for example, knowing that Jesus is God. Satan knows that too! Faith has more to do with my feet than with my head, when the message has come through the heart, down to the feet, that inspires some sort of stepping out, leading to Christianity in action. Remember, I am responsible for what I do, and for what I have failed to do.

Many of us remember Retreats when we were in school, or, perhaps occasionally since then. A Retreat is a time when we can get away from the ordinary everyday schedule of our lives, and take time out for reflection, prayer, and teachings on the gospel message. It is important to remember that we can do this any day we wish. We can all find those few quiet moments for reflection. It is out of such times that a response can come to the message we hear. Finding the time is a test of how seriously we take the message of Jesus, and how real he is in our lives. If we are too busy to have these times, then, in truth, we are too busy. Prayer is giving God time and space in our lives. There will be no response from us if we don't take time out to listen to him.

The gospel is an invitation, with R.S.V.P. written all over it. Not to respond is, in itself, a response. By becoming Christians and being part of the

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worshipping community there is a response on our part, and it is good that we have made a start. We need to make progress and growth. Lent is an ideal time "to dig around and manure" the tree of our life so that it may bring forth fruits. The "fruits" God expects from us during Lent are repentance, renewal of life, and the resulting virtues of love, compassion, mercy, forgiveness, selflessness, and humble service. Let us start producing these fruits by becoming more sensitive to the feelings of others and by accepting everyone with love and respect.

Fasting

Lent is a time when Catholics are called to carry out a three-fold mission, with the key pillars being <u>fasting</u>, <u>almsgiving</u>, and <u>prayer</u>. It is during this time that we strive to become more aware of the sacrifice that Jesus made for us on the Cross, as well as his forgiveness of our sins and unconditional love for us.

Just as Jesus fasted in the desert for forty days, we are called to forgo something for the same period when observing Lent. It is important, that while our fasting should involve a personal sacrifice and a challenge for us, we should ensure that we keep ourselves healthy.

In addition to fasting, Catholics are required to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and on Fridays during Lent.

Despite the challenge of fasting, we can take solace in knowing Jesus protects us during our struggle, as St. John Henry Newman reminds us:

"Even in our penitential exercises, Christ has gone before us to sanctify them to us. He has blessed fasting as a means of grace, in that He fasted."

During Lent, Catholics and other Christian participants are given a reprieve from fasting on Sundays as a "mini-Easter".
